The a2 Collective invites innovators, academics, and industry leaders to convene at the University of Pennsylvania's Smilow Center for Translational Research on March 19-20, 2024, for the second annual a2 National Symposium, hosted by the Penn Artificial Intelligence and Technology Collaboratory for Healthy Aging (PennAlTech). Join us for this 2-day event to engage with awardees from both the first and second a2PilotAwards.ai cohorts, healthcare executives, capital allocators, renowned academic experts, clinical researchers, and a host of tech startups ready to shape the future of AgeTech. The symposium will include keynote talks, panels, networking opportunities, and a pilot awardees poster session. Registration, a preliminary agenda, and additional event details are available on the PennAlTech website.

The National Institute on Aging (NIA) Research Centers Collaborative Network (RCCN) is offering travel awards for approximately 10 early career investigators or investigators in training to attend the symposium in person. The travel awards will cover symposium registration fee, domestic travel to and from the symposium, and hotel accommodations (see full reimbursement guidelines for additional details). Successful applicants will be affiliated with at least one center belonging to an RCCN NIA-supported center program (listed below) and have demonstrated translational or multidisciplinary interests in Al/tech and aging. Individuals from underrepresented racial and ethnic groups are particularly encouraged to apply.

#### Eligible RCCN NIA-Supported Programs:

- Alzheimer's Disease Research Centers
- Artificial Intelligence and Technology Collaboratories for Aging Research
- Centers on the Demography and Economics of Aging
- Claude D. Pepper Older Americans Independence Centers
- Nathan Shock Centers of Excellence in the Basic Biology of Aging
- Resource Centers for Minority Aging Research
- Roybal Centers for Translational Research on Aging

Affiliation with an NIA-supported center is defined as (1) having (partial) salary support through an NIA center program or (2) having previously received pilot funding, accessed center data, used center cores, or received mentoring through an NIA center program. Other forms of affiliation will also be considered.





### Eligibility

To be considered for an RCCN travel award for the second annual a2 National Symposium, applicants must:

- Be an advanced doctoral student (have completed all requirements for the degree except for the
  dissertation), postdoctoral fellow, or early stage investigator as defined by NIH
  (https://grants.nih.gov/policy/early-investigators/index.htm#definition).
- Be affiliated with or a subawardee of at least one NIA-sponsored center (i.e., AITC, Shock, Roybal, RCMAR, OAIC/Pepper, ADRC, or CDEA).
- Have demonstrated translational or multidisciplinary interest relevant to AI/tech and aging.
- Be available to attend both days of the symposium.
- Be willing to complete a post-event survey that includes a summary of what they learned at the symposium.

#### **Selection Criteria**

- Qualifications of the applicant
- Academic or R&D environment
- Demonstrated interest in a career relevant to translational or multidisciplinary research in aging
- Overall diversity of NIA centers represented among travel award recipients

The statement of interest should address what you hope to gain from the symposium.
