RLA begins the new federal fiscal year with some exciting large-scale national and international projects.

The White House Initiative on Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders (WHIAAPI): How COVID-19 Has Affected AAPI Businesses, Communities, and Individuals

In consultation with the WHIAAPI and the President's Advisory Commission on Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, RLA is conducting one-on-one interviews and surveys of AAPI voters to develop a 2020 report on how COVID-19 has affected (AAPI) businesses, communities, and individuals. Potential issues include how the CARES Act has assisted the AAPI community, as well as discrimination against AAPIs and services needed. RLA's abstract to present this project at the University of Southern California COVID-19 Work in Progress conference (see below) has been accepted

Two NIA Grants: Harmonization and Dementia in China

RLA is pleased to have been awarded two research grants by the National Institute on Aging, led by new RLA staff member Dr. James Smith. Our team will work closely with Beijing University researchers to facilitate an international research network for the harmonization of cross-national studies of aging with the Health and Retirement Study. Additional research will study early and mid-life personal, family, community, and external factors to better understand early and later-life predictors of cognitive and all-cause dementia health in China.

HHS Office of the Assistant Secretary of Health, Office of Infectious Disease and HIV/AIDS Policy (OIDP) Materials Development, Communications, and Outreach Support for Vaccine Initiatives and National Strategic Plans

Under our recently awarded contract with OIDP, RLA will continue to support work on four National Strategic Plans along with communications and outreach support for Vaccine Confidence Initiatives. This work has already included graphics for the Vaccines.gov **Boo to the Flu** toolkit, a critical public health initiative
