RLA is pleased to share some of our own adventures that will move science forward in 2021, a congressional authorization that positively impacts small businesses, and a chance to see our President and CEO, Dr. Rose Li, at the virtual Montgomery County Women's Legislative Briefing at the end of the month.

RLA research on Asian Americans & Pacific Islanders

RLA's work on three research projects have contributed to policy-related understanding of the AAPI experience in the United States, particularly during COVID-19. The first of these projects was an original analysis of AAPI-related data from the national Understanding America Survey, presented by Dr. Rose Li at the NIA-funded COVID-19 Work in Progress conference organized by the University of Southern California.

In addition to developing our own analysis of the AAPI experience of COVID-19, RLA worked closely with the President's Advisory Commission on Asian Americans & Pacific Islanders (PAC-AAPI) and the Executive Director and staff of the White House Initiative on Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders to develop the 2020 report <u>Advancing Economic Empowerment for Asian Americans and Pacific</u> <u>Islanders: A Call to Action</u>. The report provides a roadmap for the Executive Branch to implement transformational solutions that ensure full AAPI participation in the U.S. economy in 2021 and beyond.

During the coming months, RLA will bring the two strands of our AAPI research together by working with PAC-AAPI Commissioners to conduct a national survey of up to 1,000 AAPI small business owners to gather data on how they have experienced COVID-19.

Four national strategic public health plans

Although public health news has been understandably consumed by COVID-19 in 2020, other major public health threats persist. RLA was honored to work with the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Health, Office of Infectious Disease and HIV/AIDS Policy (OIDP) to produce three ambitious national strategic plans to combat <u>HIV</u>, <u>Viral Hepatitis</u>, and <u>Sexually Transmitted Infections</u>. RLA provided editing and design support for a fourth strategic plan on <u>Vaccines</u>.

To produce these plans, RLA collected, analyzed, and synthesized epidemiologic data in coordination with public health subject matter experts, reviewed and selected data points derived from various national behavioral and epidemiologic databases and surveys to provide profiles of these infectious diseases, created common design themes and templates with a more modern feel, and orchestrated the document production process. Dr. Rose Li will participate in the virtual Montgomery County Commission for Women's 41st Annual Women's Legislative Briefing on January 31. The <u>Women's Legislative Briefing</u> is the premier and longest-standing women's legislative event in the state of Maryland. Coordinated by the Montgomery County Commission for Women, the event assembles advocates, policymakers, and emerging leaders to empower, engage, and mobilize Marylanders around issues affecting women and girls throughout the state. RLA's CEO, Dr. Rose Li, will be a panelist at the January 31, 2021, event, sharing her experiences as a small business owner, Chair of the Maryland Commission on Aging, and Member of the Maryland Board of Education.

Congressional extension to 8(a) program participants

Congress has authorized a 1-year extension for firms such as RLA participating in the 8(a) business development program, due to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. A certified 8(a) small business since 2014, RLA continues to leverage the opportunities of the program to grow our capabilities and abilities to support research organizations in moving science forward. RLA will remain eligible for 8(a) awards through October 2025. We appreciate the efforts by Congress and the U.S. Small Business Administration to help small firms overcome the multiple challenges posed by the pandemic.
